**What is an Enrolled Agent?** Enrolled Agents (EAs) are the only federally-licensed tax professionals who specialize in taxation and have unlimited rights to represent taxpayers before the IRS.

**What's so great about EAs?** They are the only tax professionals with a license for "unlimited practice" issued by the United States Department of the Treasury...in other words, **Enrolled Agents are America's Tax Experts.** The Enrolled Agent's license is portable. There is no requirement to retest if you move to another state or another country.
